# Year-by-Year Guidance & Support

#### 2nd & 3rd Year:

 Subject choice guidance, study skills, learning support.

#### **Transition Year:**

Career talks, CV and interview workshops, TY work experience.

#### 5th & 6th Year:

- One-to-one career counselling.
- CAO, apprenticeships, and job application support.
- Mental health and study skills workshops.





# Transition and Induction

We understand that starting secondary school is an important milestone for students and their families. To make this transition as smooth and positive as possible, Ballyhaunis Community School offers a comprehensive induction programme. This includes visits to primary schools, open afternoon, and information evenings for parents and guardians.

Students also benefit from dedicated 'meet and greet' sessions, allowing them to become familiar with the school environment and staff before term begins.

# Junior Cycle

Students follow the Junior Cycle Programme in their first three years, studying a broad range of subjects designed to build core skills and knowledge.

#### **Assessment**

Assessment combines classroom-based projects and final exams, culminating in the Junior Cycle Profile of Achievement at the end of 3rd year.

Wellbeing is a key focus, with Physical Education, Guidance, SPHE, CSPE, and ICT integrated into the curriculum.







# TY-Transition Year Programme

Transition Year Programme offers a unique, oneyear programme encouraging personal, social, educational, and vocational growth. It promotes student responsibility and prepares learners for senior cycle and beyond.



In addition to the core subjects: English, Irish, Maths, Languages and STEM subjects, students experience a diverse range of modules including:

- Erasmus & Tours

Students are encouraged to take a greater responsibility for their own learning and decision making. Transition Year Programme enables students to make the transition from the more dependent type of learning associated with Junior Cycle to the more independent learning environment associated with Senior Cycle and equips them with the skills necessary to achieve their full potential in the Leaving Cert exam.

Through work experience, students are prepared for the world of work and develop their role as autonomous, participative and responsible members of society. The school recognises that assessment is an integral part of teaching and learning process - assessments and certification within Transition Year is school-based.





# Leaving Certificate Programmes

The Leaving Certificate Programme combines core subjects with a wide choice of options, allowing students to tailor their studies to their interests and career goals.

### **Leaving Cert Vocational Programme (LCVP)**

LCVP adds a vocational dimension, combining traditional Leaving Certificate subjects with Link Modules focusing on enterprise, work experience and community. It provides practical skills and qualifications recognised by higher education institutes.

#### **Leaving Certificate Applied (LCA)**

LCA is a two-year programme aimed at preparing students for adult life and employment. It includes:

#### 1. Vocational Preparation

Focusing on preparation for work and work experience.

#### 2. General Education

Giving students general life skills.

#### 3. Social Education

Explore topics related to self-awareness, interpersonal relationships, health care and contemporary social, economic, political and cultural issues.

Graduates receive a Leaving Certificate at Pass, Merit, or Distinction level and can progress to further education or apprenticeships.


